Dear Parents and Carers,

I am very pleased to invite you to the Governors meeting with Parents/Carers, to be held at the school at 7pm on Thursday, 19th June 2008. It will be an opportunity to discuss the content of the report which covers the period from April 2007 to June 2008. The Governors will welcome the chance to meet with you and hear your views.

The monthly newsletters will have kept you informed of the busy schedule of the school and the wide range of extra-curricular activities and opportunities available for all Students. The school continues to be very popular and pupil numbers have exceeded 700 for the first time, which has put additional pressure on the accommodation. We are looking forward to moving in to the new building and the refurbished rooms in the existing building in September.

Including the new building, our capacity will be 776 Students and the Admission Limit for each year group will be 123. In addition to new rooms, we will also have more hard play surface for the Students.

The school strives to develop each Student and to nurture individual interests and talents. The members of Staff forming the Transition Group have worked very closely with our colleagues in the Primary schools to ease the move to the secondary school. We this will make the transition easier and reduce the stress for Students and their Parents. The period of induction of Year 6 Students will be extended from one day to a full week in July 2008.

The academic achievements at KS3, KS4 and Sixth Form have been excellent once again and reflect the quality of teaching and learning that occurs. I would like to congratulate the Staff, Students and Parents and to thank them for their hard work.

The positive partnership which exists between Students, Teachers, Parents and Governors is fundamental to our success. On behalf of the Governing Body, I should like to thank you for your support and positive contributions this year.

SCHOOL COUNCIL

Builth Wells High School Council has continued to go from strength to strength by initiating various activities within school and also taking part in exciting and innovative new projects both locally and nationally.

The Council and Year 7 pupils were part of the National Survey for the “Our Rights, Our Story” project which was carried out in May 2007. Builth Wells High School was the only school in Powys to take part in the national survey which was part of the reporting process to the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child. Pupils were asked a series of questions on a variety of topics including, health, education, participation and special interest which built up a picture of what it is like to be a child growing up in Wales today. The findings were presented to the United Nations earlier this year and a full copy of the Report has now been published and is available from school.

Two of our Council members have represented the school at Powys YOB residential meetings and we currently have two representatives, namely Tom Lake Y13 and Tom Childs Y8, on Funky Dragon (Children and Young People’s Assembly for Wales).

Council members have organised two discos for Year 7 pupils and held several cake sales and would like to thank parents and staff for their help.

BWHS Council now includes representatives from each year group, including 6th form, Learning Support, Powys YOB and the Eco-School Council.

An interesting presentation from Clic-on-line, Careers Wales was very well received in March this year and it is hoped that the School Council members will be able to pass plenty of valuable information on to their peers regarding access to this excellent resource.

On Activities Day last year, the Council and potential Council members took part in an action packed training day which was delivered by Dynamix Ltd of Cardiff.

Special mention should go to Tom Lake for his continued hard work on behalf of the Council.

Report on Learning Support **2007/2008**

The following numbers of pupils are on the Additional Learning Needs register:

- 25 with Statements of Special Educational Need
- 2 on Enhanced School Action Plus
- 14 on School Action Plus
- 54 on School Action
- 11 Looked After Children

The Department has one full time teacher and one part time who is also Additional Learning Needs Co-ordinator. There are currently four full time and five part time Learning Support Assistants. Liz Price was appointed in a new role in September and is also full time. A wide variety of services is provided within the school including:

- Catch Up Reading Initiative
- School Council co-ordination
- Community Focus Schools Link
- Support for cultural and sporting events
- Support for pupils following an Alternative Curriculum
- Involvement in the Primary Schools Transition Link
- Support for the Literacy Initiative
- Support for pupils on work experience
- Induction of new pupils
- Co-ordination and recording of multi-disciplinary meetings

This academic year has seen school admit 5 pupils for whom English is an additional language. The department has worked closely with Nigel Topley (EAL adviser) in order to best support these pupils. We have continued to work extensively with a variety of other agencies and specialists including:

- Ian Elliot - Penmaes School
- Derrin Gaskell - Behaviour Management Adviser, Brynllwarch Hall School
- Mary Sterry - Specialist Teacher, Hearing Impaired
- Tina Davenport - Educational Psychologist
- Social Services
- Alison Peddie - Social Inclusion
- Chris Davies - Education Welfare
- Complementary Education

In response to changes in access arrangements for GCSE, Lucy Bronwin has worked closely with Tina Davenport assessing pupils for eligibility for special examination arrangements. This has required a considerable level of personal input on Lucy's behalf and it is of great benefit to the school to be able to carry out these assessments.

Physical Education Department

The PE department would like to share with you some of the many successes we have had throughout the year.

Our 2007 GCSE results were one of the best in the school with 95% of pupils achieving an A*-C grade and 100% of pupils achieving A*-D grades. These results would not be possible without the hard work and commitment from both pupils and staff.

In December we held our Gymnastic and Dance evening which involved over 80 pupils from different year groups who performed in a superb evening of dance and gymnastic routines. The year 10/11 rugby teams, who will be going on tour to Australia, kicked off the show with 'their versions' of the Australian Hakka. The evening was a huge success raising over £1000 for the department and forthcoming Australian Sport Tour. As usual the PE staff were 'clowning around' during the evening! A huge thank you to all the pupils and parents who supported the evening as without them the evening would not be possible, also the praise and positive comments at the end of the performance made all the hard work worth while.

As a department we are very fortunate that we have the support and encouragement from the school to enter the different sporting activities throughout the year. So far this year we have competed in the following county events; Rugby, Soccer, Netball, Hockey, Swimming, Gymnastics, Cross Country, Rounders and Athletics (59 pupils competed in the athletics)

Key Points for Action from Estyn Inspection 2004

The school has a good record of self-development, has maintained high standards and has continued to improve. In order to enhance this picture of success, the Headteacher, staff and governors should:

- Maintain the school's positive features and ethos and the consistency of teaching and learning
- Raise standards in those subjects and aspects described as satisfactory in the report
- Extend planning to improve standards in numeracy and ICT across all subjects of the curriculum
- By using the good practice observed, establish consistent monitoring and lesson observation procedures in all departments
- Develop further and use existing self-evaluation, monitoring and review procedures to assess and maximise the implementation and effectiveness of whole school initiatives
- Work closely with Powys County Council to ensure an acceptable solution to the identified shortcomings of the accommodation, including for the increasing number of pupils on roll, in Welsh medium classes and an expanding Sixth Form
- Ensure that all classes are provided with a daily act of collective worship

The school has a good record of self development, has maintained high standards and has continued to improve. In order to enhance this picture of success, the Headteacher, staff and Governors should:

1. Maintain the school's positive features and ethos and the consistency of teaching and learning.
2. Raise standards in those subjects and aspects described as satisfactory in the Report.
3. Extend planning to improve standards in numeracy and ICT across all subjects of the curriculum.
4. By using the good practice observed, establish consistent monitoring and lesson observation procedures in all departments.
5. Develop further and use existing self-evaluation, monitoring and review procedures to assess and maximise the implementation and effectiveness of whole school initiatives.
6. Work closely with the Unitary Authority to ensure an acceptable solution to the identified shortcomings of the accommodation, including for the increasing number of pupils on roll, in Welsh Medium classes and an expanding Sixth Form.
7. Ensure that all classes are provided with a daily act of collective worship.
